

to become the focal point of the design. "Initially they couldn't digest it, as they felt the tree was humongous and would cause space constraints," explains Menon.

While the fine dining area inside seats 45, the outdoor area seats 24 and the bar has a capacity of 30. The bar out side caters to guests in both the inside and outside sectio. For those looking at only having starters or only enjoying a drink or two, this section stays clear of the dining area, so that the bar flies don't feel like they are eating into someone's dining space. The inside section has a dedicate floor space for those who would like to hang out at the bar or even shake a leg to the well-chosen music.

The use of wood in the interiors is unconventional. The interiors are enchanting and give you the feeling of being transported to an exotic country. The look and feel of the place is international, and the attention to detail is what immediately catches one's eye.

Art plays an important role here. The enormous acrylic-lit tubes running parallel in the bar area are a conversation piece, the blown-glass bottles were special designed for the niches, the dining area has resin lamps with embedded onion peels suspended overhead, threedimensional woven fabric blinds cut the sunlight, while the outdoor area has sail shades of tensile fabric.

Vivek and Sumessh of V&S Associates take great prid in being part of a design studio based in contemporary India that caters to clients in different parts of the world Their handcrafted woodwork, ceiling wall panelling and customised material palette has been researched, prototyped and applied after years of development with loca *karigars* and a profound understanding of materials.

The lattices, local woods and inlays in Trikaya reflect the use of Indian techniques and craftsmanship to create a contemporary space. From cast-in-situ floors and bartops to resin-bonded stone counters and machine-printe tabletops, conventional design has been turned on its head to great the effect.

For V&S Associates, the most challenging aspect of th project was the need to complete it in 95 days. "We over came the challenge by working on it 24x7, for which we literally shacked up at the site. Our vendors and contract tors made a huge contribution," acknowledges Menon. I
